- \* Why they formed the Academy - to touch the lives of special needs children through workshops and programs of enrichment support.
- \* Have supported "All-Island Handicapped Sports," disabilities awareness programs and horseback riding.
- \* Most recently they have made a special effort to support art programs for special needs children.

The monies donated will be used to enhance their Saturday Respite program, the only arts-based Saturday Respite Program in Nassau County specifically created for children with special needs.

Then it was down to business to learn about three more qualified charities and vote on the next charity who would receive their members' donation. The organization's members chose the Hospice Care Network as their next charity.
